

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What do the groups offer?

Parenting is the most important job to do and it can be hard at times.

Parents say that these courses help them to practice new ways to manage their children's behaviour, and to build a positive relationship with their children.

How can I get a place?

1. Is your child 3 or 4 years of age?
2. Does your child live with you or do you have weekly contact with your child?
3. Does your child show difficult behaviours?
4. Can you attend weekly sessions?

Speak to your Health Visitor, Social Worker or Nursery Staff about a referral.

They will ask you to complete a questionnaire about your child's behaviour and a referral form. They can help you with this.
